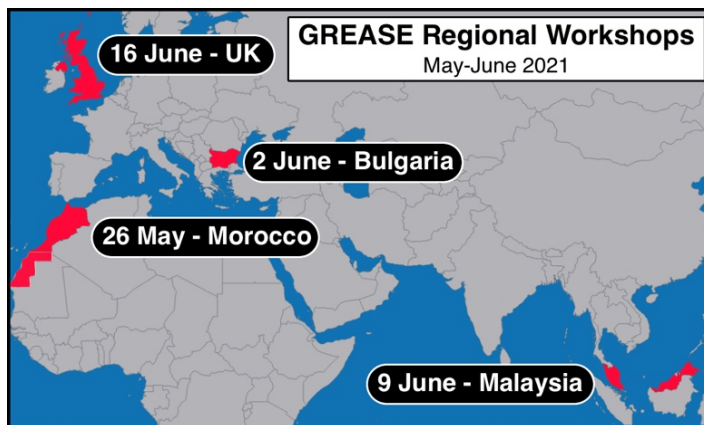


EU-funded GREASE research project launches workshop series on religious diversity, secularism, and violent radicalisation

The GREASE research project announces a series of regional workshops addressing governance of religious diversity and religiously motivated violent radicalisation on three continents. Each of the four workshops focuses on a separate geographical region ranging from Western and Eastern Europe to North Africa and Southeast Asia. The hybrid events are being held on four consecutive Wednesdays starting on May 26, 2021.



The first workshop, hosted by GREASE's consortium partner in Rabat, Morocco, will address the topic of **Religiously Motivated Violent Radicalisation in the MENA Region: Root Causes and Policies Addressing It**.
